Frequently Asked Questions

1. Who should attend this course?

*Besides being a requirement to become a **trained** Boy Scout leader, Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills benefits any adult troop leader, Venturing Leader, 2nd Year Webelos Scout Leader or any interested Committee Member who wants to learn or teach the basic Outdoor Skills required of a Boy Scout.*

2. I have very little camping experience and I feel a little intimidated about attending the course, should I still plan on attending?

This is an Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills. Together with the staff, we will experience the 'Outdoor Requirements' of our Scouts and just like the youth you will teach, the skills you will be instructed on and participate in during this weekend will be honed and polished over a lifetime of practice and use. *If you don't have them, this is the time and place to begin learning those skills!*

3. I already consider myself pretty doggone experienced in the outdoors, should I still plan on attending?

*By all means YES! Besides being a prerequisite to becoming a **trained** Boy Scout leader, it's not just what you know but how you use that knowledge to "Deliver the Promise" of scouting. We can show those of you with loads of outdoor experience how to integrate*

your knowledge into the Scouting program to provide a quality experience for the youth!

4. Who will be teaching the course?

Scouters just like you who have gone through this and other training courses and want to help by instructing those who serve the youth directly.

5. What do I need to do or bring?

After your application is accepted by the Course Director, you will receive a letter of acceptance with a map, instructions and an equipment list. We'll provide most of the equipment but you'll need a few things like a tent and sleeping bag. The equipment list will provide greater detail.

6. Will this be in a classroom setting?

Well, yes...Baden Powell considered the outdoors a classroom. We will model the training methods you'll be using with the youth: Tell Me, Show Me, Let Me Do It.

7. How do I register?

Fill out the attached registration form and send it along with your payment of \$25.00 dollars to the address provided.

8. What does the Course Fee pay for?

Training courses are not set up to make money but we can't lose money either! Each Course Director and his staff try to work out a "break even" budget in order to give you the best "bang for the buck". The course fee covers the cost of food, course materials, insurance and camp usage fees.

9. Why do you need my email address?

To keep the cost of mailings to a minimum, we prefer to send you course information via email. If you do not have an email address, we'll send it via postal mail.

It's the goal of the staff and your fellow scouts to present *Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills* in a fun and exciting manner so that you may take outdoor skills back to your youth and adult leaders.
