



The Legend of Talakto: Camporee

Overview

Your patrol must Link together to form a team and overcome challenges. Along the way you will earn rupees that can be redeemed later for gear and arrows. The fate of Talakto depends on you!

You can do as much or as little at camporee as you wish. There will be times for challenges, times for fun and games, times for ceremonies, and time for just relaxing. Here is the general schedule showing the major activities. Final details will be provided at Friday's Leader Meeting and Saturday's Opening Ceremony.

Please be prepared to host at least one staffer for a meal. Staffer will provide their own mess kit and water bottle.

Patrol Gear

To successfully complete the Camporee, each patrol should bring the following equipment and be prepared to carry it in addition to their personal gear needed for challenges:

- 1 filled water bottle per Scout
- At least 1 compass (baseplate style)
- At least 1 folding knife
- Two 4 ft staves
- Sturdy blanket
- Matches
- Duct tape
- Patrol First Aid kit
- Paper on which to write
- Pencils
- Scout handbook

Challenges (events subject to change due to participation or staffing levels)

- Orienteering – Find all of the chickens and get a special award from a villager.
- String Burn – Build a sustaining fire to keep you warm through the night and ward off the Re-deads.
- Magnesis – Use the power of magnesis to move metal orbs into the nuclear core.
- Link's Inventory (Kim's Game) – Link has dropped his entire inventory and can't remember what he had. Help him remember.
- Stretcher with Obstacle Course – Use your skills to transport Ilia across Highrule to Kakariko village.
- Blindfold Tent / Sheet Fold – Link's ship keeps getting broken apart by the waves. Tighten up.
- Bear Bag Hang – Lynels are in the area. Learn how to protect your food.
- Measure the height of the cliff or distance across the river before attempting to cross. Link only has so much stamina. If he falls or drowns, its game over. Check your stamina.

General Camporee Guidelines and Rules

The following rules are the general framework around which all camporees are operated. A spirit of Scouting courtesy and brotherhood must prevail during the entire camporee if it is to be a success. The Scout Oath, Law, and Outdoor Code are the guidelines for all behavior. Troops or individuals who do not conform to this spirit will be asked to leave the camporee.

Cost – All units must stop at the Staff Area to pay fees and complete registration. A registration fee of \$20.00 for each Scouts USA, Webelos, and adult leader or adult will be charged to cover the expense of camporee venue, supplies, patches, and awards. The registration fee applies regardless of whether or not a unit camps overnight at the camporee.

Events – Events and activities are planned by Kaskanampo Order of the Arrow members, Saturday morning through Saturday afternoon culminating in closing campfire ceremonies at 8:15 PM. All patrols will be assigned for a shotgun start. All events will be conducted in patrol groups. Each Patrol Leader will be responsible for leading his patrol through all stations and be responsible for keeping track of all of his/her patrol mates.

Tour Permits: Per Greater Alabama Council regulations “A tour permit is not required for activities engaged within the confines of the Greater Alabama Council.” Unit leaders are encouraged to review the online training modules available, and stay current with them.

Uniforms: Troops should arrive and depart in field uniform. The field uniform is also requested for Saturday evening’s closing ceremony. For Saturday activities Scouts may dress in activity uniforms appropriate for the events and the weather.

Medical/First Aid: Limited Medical/First Aid assistance will be available. The first aid location will be adjacent to the pavilion.

Order of the Arrow Callout – If you wish to have any of your newly elected OA members called out at the closing campfire, use the form in this guide for listing them. Turn this list in at the Friday night Cracker Barrel.

Cracker Barrel – A Cracker Barrel will be held Friday night at 9:30 PM for the Senior Patrol Leaders and Scoutmasters. Final camporee instructions will be distributed and last minute questions answered. Each troop/crew is invited to bring a snack item such as cookies, crackers, or cakes, etc. to share with everyone.

Campsite Assignment – For email-in registration, each unit can choose up to three choices for campsite location. Assignments will be made based on order of receipt of the registration package. See the map on the last page of this guide for campsite locations. Camping will be “Jamboree Style”, so maintain close distances between tents. Each campsite will consist of three “blocks” on the referenced map. Each “block” is 40 feet across.

Campsite Inspections – Campsites will be inspected and scored Saturday morning using the inspection form found in this packet. This form will be used as part of the total score for the unit during the weekend. An adult unit leader may be present so that the information found can be shared to allow

the unit to improve their campsite. This would also be a good opportunity to clarify any questions that may arise.

Water: Water will be available at the camporee next to the pavilion. Each troop should bring containers for transport and storage.

Parking: Parking will **ONLY** be allowed in designated parking areas. Trailer and tow vehicle **ONLY** are to remain in camping areas. All other vehicles must be moved to the assigned parking area after unloading camping equipment.

Fires and Waste– This will be a “no ground fire” camping experience. Plan on propane powered stoves and grills, or charcoal in raised tables for all cooking. Troops and Crews will be responsible for removal from the site all ashes. Do not dispose of ashes in dumpsters or any waste receptacle. Troops must remove all garbage from the camporee site. Do not pile trash bags on the road or campsite. **Each Troop must remove their garbage from the Camporee grounds.**

Patches – Patches, similar to the artwork on the front cover of this package will be provided after campsite inspection and turn in of evaluation forms. A very limited edition of one dozen 8” back-patch of the camporee patch is available for pre-order. These are \$40.00 each.

Adopt a Staff Member for Meals – Staff members who have home units at the camporee are encouraged to eat with their units. Units willing to adopt a staff member to eat with them should mark the registration form accordingly regarding which meals and how many staff will be invited.

Webelos–Are invited to overnight with a host troop with their parent or parental approved responsible adult. Cub scouts pay \$20 for 2 nights camping or \$10 for 1 night camping.

Taps and Reveille: Taps will be at 11:00 p.m. each evening and reveille will be at 6:30 a.m. Quiet hours are to be observed between those times. Troops should plan to arrive at the camporee site in ample time to have their campsite established before Taps. There were numerous complaints about noise and talking after taps last year. Leaders are encouraged to maintain quiet times to be respectful of their neighbors.

Staff Camping Area: Staff camping will be near the pavilion, adjacent to the stone/wood fence. This is for staff that will be working past 11:00 taps.

Meals: Troops are responsible for providing for their own meals while at the camporee.

Visitors: Visitors are welcome at the camporee. Visitors to a troop campsite must have the permission of the unit leader. Visitors are welcome to attend field events and the Saturday closing ceremony, and may bring picnic lunches and/or dinner to the camporee. Visitors must depart the camporee site before Taps.

Tobacco: The use of tobacco products in any form by Scouts under the age of 18 years is prohibited. Due to documented health risks associated with tobacco use and the need for a positive image, adults are requested to abstain from the use of tobacco at the camporee.

Conduct: The use of profane language, malicious or damaging pranks, and improper use of knives, axes or flammables may result, at a minimum, in the disqualification of a patrol from any competition. Severe offenses will result in a request to leave the camporee site. Fireworks and firearms of any type are not permitted.

Flags: Troops are encouraged to bring, display, and carry troop and patrol flags.

Saturday Closing Ceremonies: The campfire program will include skits and camporee award presentations.

Sunday Scout's Own Service: A Scout's Own Service will be performed Sunday morning. All Scouts and Scoutmasters are encouraged to attend.

Severe Weather: Due to the potential for severe weather, the National Weather Service emergency broadcast frequency will be monitored by the Camporee Staff. Each troop will be notified in the event of a weather advisory, tornado watch, or warning.

Checkout: All troops must checkout with the camporee staff and have a campsite inspection. Patches will be issued when Camporee Evaluation Forms have been submitted. Troops may leave the camporee Saturday night following the closing ceremonies. If a troop elects to leave on Saturday, they should break camp and have a campsite inspection before dark. Please notify the Camporee Staff at registration if your troop plans to leave Saturday night.

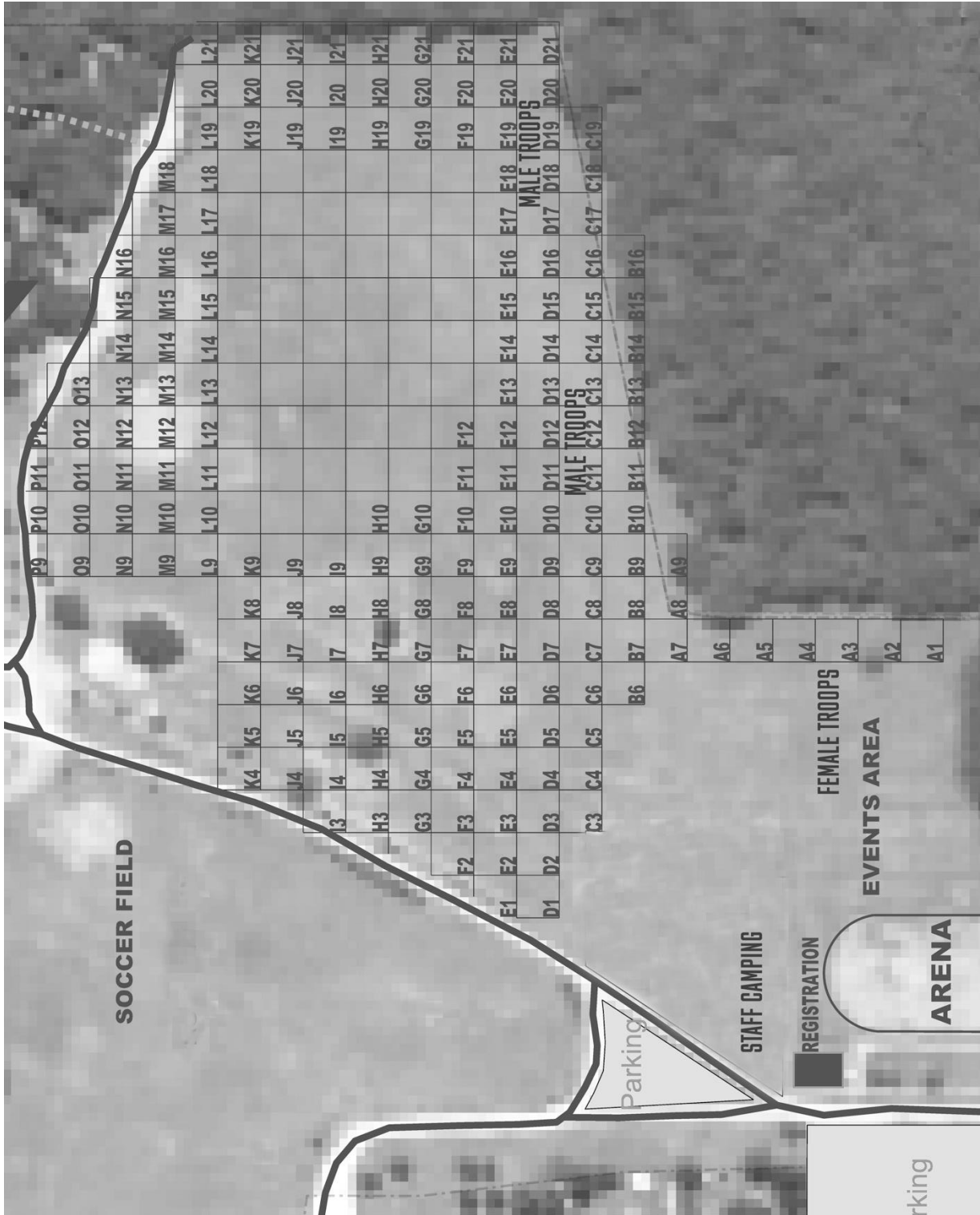
